

Waiting for Christ

The word Advent originates from the Latin word *Adventus* which means "coming" or "arrival." Advent prepares us for the coming of Jesus Christ in all ways, from His birth, to our lives now, to His Second Coming. Advent is the first season in our Liturgical Year. Starting this Sunday, we start the 2023 Liturgical Year and will move from reading the Gospel of Luke to the Gospel of Matthew.

Wednesday, **November 30th is the Feast Day of St Andrew**, disciple of Jesus and brother of Peter. Andrew too was waiting for Christ. All of the Jews at the time of the incarnation were waiting for the Messiah whom they hoped would free them from the Romans.

In John 1, Andrew was already a disciple of John the Baptist when Jesus walked by and John proclaimed: "Behold the Lamb of God." Upon hearing this, Andrew left John and followed Jesus with another disciple. Jesus turned and asked them, "What do you seek?" In response they asked "Rabbi, where are you staying?" He said to them "Come and See!" Andrew joyfully runs off to find his brother Peter and exclaims "We have found the Messiah"

While Peter is often mentioned in Scripture, it was Andrew who brought Peter to Jesus. In John 6, it is Andrew who lets Jesus know there is a boy with fish with which Jesus feeds the multitude. In John 12, it is Andrew who brings the Greeks, who have come to Jerusalem seek Jesus and to worship, to Jesus.

This Advent let us not simply wait. We should remember Andrew's Joy in knowing Jesus and bring others to Him as Andrew did.
