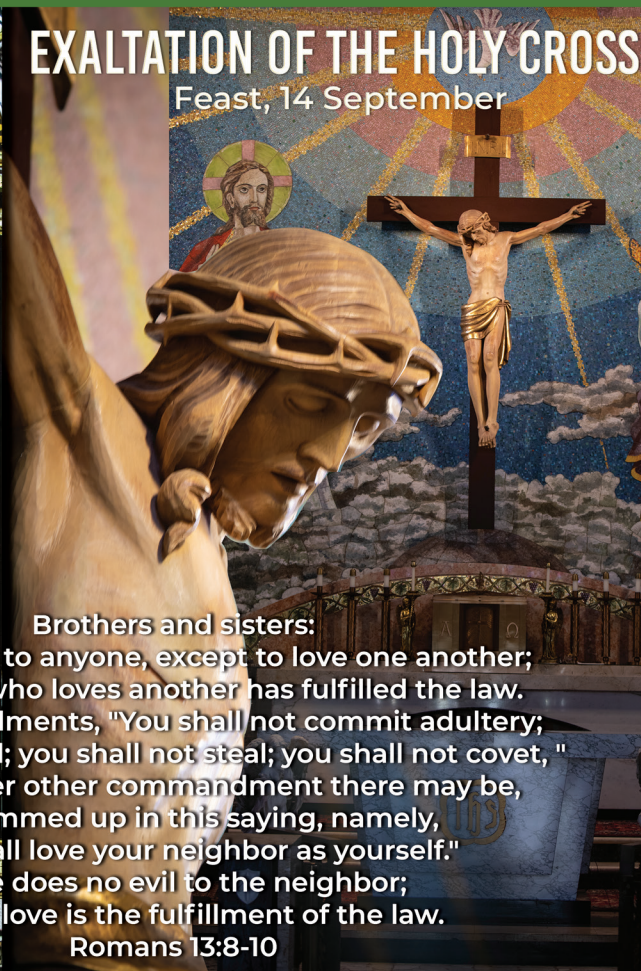

BEATIFICATION OF THE ULMA FAMILY

10 września 2023 w Markowej na Podkarpaciu odbędzie się beatyfikacja dziewięcioosobowej rodziny Józefa i Wiktorii Ulmów, zamordowanych przez Niemców za pomoc Żydom. Będzie to pierwsza w historii Kościoła beatyfikacja całej rodziny. Wraz z kard. Marcello Semeraro, mszę św. koncelebrować będzie blisko tysiąc kapłanów oraz 80 kardynałów i biskupów z Polski i zagranicy.

Józef i Wiktoria Ulmowie mieszkali we wsi Markowa w przedwojennym województwie lwowskim, obecnie podkarpackim. Wiosną 1944 r. Ulmowie zostali zadenuncjowani, że ukrywają Żydów.

Niemieccy żandarmi z posterunku w Łańcutu 24 marca 1944 r. dokonali masakry w domu Ulmów. Najpierw zginęli Żydzi – Golda Goldman, Genia Goldman oraz jej małe dziecko, a także trzech bracia Szallowie, ich 70-letni ojciec oraz kolejny mężczyzna z rodziny Szallowów.

Na oczach dzieci rozstrzelano Józefa Ulmę i jego żonę Wiktorię, która była w siódmym miesiącu ciąży. Potem zabito dzieci – ośmioletnią Stanisławę, sześcioletnią Barbarę, pięcioletniego Władysława, czteroletniego Franciszka, trzyletniego Antoniego i półtoraroczną Marię. W masakrze zginęło 16 osób.

On September 10, 2023 in Markowa in Podkarpacie, Poland, the beatification of the nine-member family of Józef and Wiktoria Ulma, murdered by the Germans for helping Jews, will take place. This will be the first beatification of the entire family in the history of the Church. Together with Card. Marcello Semeraro, Holy Mass nearly a thousand priests and 80 cardinals and bishops from Poland and abroad will concelebrate.

Józef and Wiktoria Ulma lived in the village of Markowa in the pre-war Lwów, now Podkarpacie. In the spring of 1944, the Ulmas were denounced that they were hiding Jews.

On March 24, 1944, German gendarmes from the police station in Łańcut carried out a massacre in the Ulma house. First, the Jews died - Golda Goldman, Genia Goldman and her little child, as well as the three Szall brothers, their 70-year-old father and another man from the Szall family.

Józef Ulma and his wife Wiktoria, who was seven months pregnant, were shot in front of the children. Then the children were killed - eight-year-old Stanisława, six-year-old Barbara, five-year-old Władysław, four-year-old Franciszek, three-year-old Antoni and one-and-a-half-year-old Maria. 16 people died in the massacre.
