


# SAINT JOSEPH

#### February 14th - Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday officially begins LENT and the EASTER CYCLE on any date from FEBRUARY 4TH TO MARCH 10TH, depending upon the date of

Easter Sunday.

In 2024, Ash Wednesday BEGINS ON FEBRUARY 14TH. ASHES from burned palms saved from the previous year are placed on the foreheads of parishioners.

The custom of placing blessed ASHES on the heads of people is an ancient penitential practice common among the Jewish people (Jonah 3:5-9; Jeremiah 6:26, 25:34; Matthew 11:21).

Three kinds of traditions have given LENT its particular character today: (1) those that support a somber atmosphere; (2) penitential practices, especially FASTING AND FRIDAY ABSTINENCE OF MEATS; and (3) devotions centered around the Suffering Jesus. During the past twenty years these traditions have been joined by newer ones, adding a more positive dimension to LENT.

## **Pre-Lenten Traditions!**

Though there is no mention on the calendar of the Church. The American tradition of Mardi Gras (French "Fat Tuesday) began as a pre-Lenten day of feasting and carnival (Latin "carnelevarium," or "removal of meats"). It was a "last fling" in preparation for the severe fasting and abstinence which began the next day on Ash Wednesday. In ethnic Polish American areas the baking, selling, and eating of PACZKI (pronounced: punch-key) is very popular the day BEFORE Ash Wednesday. These are heavy deep-fried Polish pastries filled with various fruits and often with a glazed topping! They are now found in many area supermarkets.
