

CONSECRATION OF NEW LITURGICAL ALTAR



WE BEGIN OUR PRAYERS THIS MORNING WITH A PRAYER OF DEDICATION FOR THIS OUR NEW ALTAR:

Dear Father in Heaven,

At the altars of the Old Testament Prophets, unblemished lambs and other animals were sacrificed in atonement for the sin of people.

On the Altar of the Cross your Only Son, Jesus, the Sinless Lamb of God, was sacrificed as a once and for all final Sacrifice for the sins of the whole world. Jesus, turned the table of the Upper Room into a new type of altar, one on which a Holy Meal was served.

"This is my body," Jesus said. "This is my blood. For the forgiveness of sins, do this in memory of me."

For 2,000 years now, in many times and many places, believers have gathered around Altars to continue to celebrate the HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS.
