

St. Vincent de Paul & the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings this week (Amos 8:4-7, 1 Tim. 2:1-8, Luke 16:1-13) pair beautifully with the life of St. Vincent de Paul, who was born in the south of France in 1580 or 1581. The third of six children in a peasant family, his ambition was to become a priest and get an office in the Church where he could obtain enough money to retire early, return home, and support his family. He was ordained on 23 September 1600. Despite two trips to Rome, the promise of being made Bishop, and some money left to him in a will, Vincent's early ambitions failed. He was a steward of the Church, desiring to use the priesthood for his own monetary gain. He was squandering God's property. Little is known of Vincent's life from 1605 to 1607 beyond a letter he wrote claiming to have been captured and enslaved in North Africa. He writes that he was enslaved to four different masters, the last of which was a fallen-away Christian whom Vincent brings back to Christ. Freed, Vincent returns to France. While it is known that Vincent wrote the letter, it is not known if it is an accounting of actual slavery or if it is an allegory for Vincent's personal spiritual journey to freedom.

We do know that in 1608, he came to Paris. There, a judge with whom he was living accused him of stealing money. Though innocent (the actual thief confessed years later), Vincent remained silent and allowed the humiliation of being turned out into the streets. In 1612, he became the pastor (for the first time) of the poor parish of Saint-Medard in Clichy. He loved being a pastor - the poor people of the parish touched his heart. He told his bishop he was happier than the bishop or even the pope. Shortly after, he was recalled to Paris to serve a wealthy family as a Chaplain and tutor of their children. Here his faith was tested. He had what his younger self wanted, but he despised the spiritual neglect of the peasants on their estate. He wrote out the Creed and carried it in his breast pocket to remind him what he believed in. He emerged from this Trial of Faith 3-4 years later, promising God to consecrate his life to serving the poor.
