Our Lady of the Rosary

The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary (originally Our Lady of Victory) was established by Saint Pius V on the anniversary of the naval victory won by the Christian fleet at Lepanto on 7 October 1571. It was formed in memory and in perpetual gratitude of the miraculous victory that the Lord gave to his Christian people against the Turkish armada.

The Battle of Lepanto was the last major naval battle fought almost entirely between rowing vessels. The victory was attributed to Mary's intervention as the Christian fleet was vastly outnumber with the wind against them. Knowing the imbalance, Pope Pius V implored the Holy League to pray for Mary's intercession via the use of the Rosary.

October has become known as the Month of the Holy Rosary indicating the profound significance of reflecting on the life of Jesus through the meditations of Mary's experience and the power of Mary's intercession. At the end of his weekly general audience on Sept. 24, Pope Leo XIV requested that this October, all the faithful daily pray the Rosary for peace: "I invite everyone to pray the rosary every day during the coming month ~ for peace ~ personally, with your families and in your communities."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Thank you for your continuing support, generosity and commitment to our Parish. The financial reports for the fiscal year ending in June can be found at the entrance of the church. Please take a copy on your way home today.

For the fiscal year of July 2024 through June 2025, our Sunday offertory, maintenance, and memorial donation collections totaled just under \$90,000 or approximately 30% of our operating expenses. Other Revenue comprised of candles, flowers, stipends and fundraising additional \$18,000 with the remainder covered by withdrawals from our endowments. This year alone we withdrew \$143,000 in order to pay the ordinary expenses as well as complete the painting of the parish hall, purchase new candlesticks and candelabra for the sanctuary, repair the heat pump in the church, upgrade the Rectory bathroom (which was an insurance recommendation), and install security cameras on the property. The state grant which covered the camera cost and installation was received in August and will be reflected in this fiscal year's income. Fortunately, our investments do generate approximately \$60,000 in income annually, which partially offsets the withdrawal of principal. This year the market was very favorable and even with the withdrawals, our investment balances at the end of June are greater than last year.

Overall, expenses were similar to last year across most categories except for the repairs mentioned above. Excluding payroll, our largest expenditure continues to arise from utilities, repairs & maintenance and property/liability insurance. Please know, however, if not for the generous donation of some volunteers who give freely of their time and talent, especially in the preparation of the weekly bulletin, directing religious education and maintenance of the church properties, our expenses would be much greater. This year's expenses did include the final bankruptcy settlement of \$3,000 from our parish. We do not anticipate any future expenses associated with the settlement nor do we anticipate any large costly projects requiring significant cash this fiscal year.

Thank you again for all that you share with our Parish every day. We are blessed with many volunteers who work so faithfully on the parish bulletin, church property and at parish events. May the Lord continue to bless each of you and your loved ones.
