### Saint Luke, Feast Day, October 18

Luke was a Greek scholar, physician (Col 4:14), and "fellow worker" (Philemon 24) with the apostle Paul. He accompanied Paul on his journey to Rome and is known as the author of the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. As a Greek Gentile, he wrote for Gentile Christians, Matthew, Mark, and John all came from the Jewish tradition. Luke is the only Evangelist who, like most of us today, was a Gentile. Accordingly, Luke emphasizes the theme of universality, stressing that the Gospel is intended for all people, particularly the poor and sinners.

We have been reading the Gospel of Luke at Sunday Mass throughout our current Liturgical Year. His Gospel has several unique aspects not found in the other Gospels, including: the Annunciation (Luke 1:26-38), the child Jesus in the temple (Luke 2:41-51), the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37), the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32), and the Ascension (Luke 24:50-53). Luke is also the author of several beautiful hymns, including the Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55), the Benedictus (Luke 1:68-79), the Gloria (Luke 2:14), and the Nunc **Dimittis** (Luke 2:29-35).

Luke's Gospel repeatedly emphasizes that Jesus' entire ministry is a progression toward Jerusalem and the Cross. The traditional symbol for Luke is a winged ox or bull, due to his Gospel's emphasis on the sacrificial nature of Jesus' ministry. Likewise, we each must take up the Cross and follow Jesus on our own passage of sacrifice. This journey requires a deep life of prayer, and Luke consistently portrays Jesus in prayer, seeking the Father's will (Luke 5:16, 6:12, 23:34, 46). May we do the same, knowing that God speaks and we respond through the Prayer of the Mass.

According to one ancient tradition, Luke was said to have died in Greece, unmarried, at the age of 84, while other traditions report his martyrdom.
